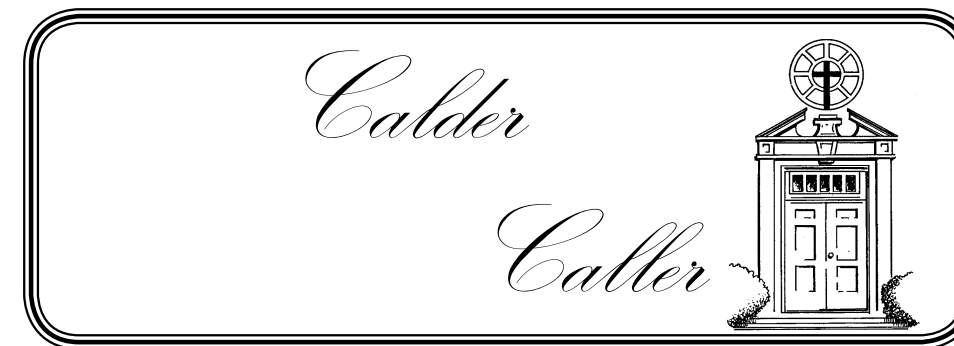

You can invite your friends and neighbors to this event with complete confidence that the evening will enhance our spiritual journey with some of the best Christian music ever written and performed. Lead violinist, Matthew Detrick currently serves at the Acting Concertmaster for The Symphony of Southeast Texas. Matthew has composed the program specifically for us to help us fulfill our desire to recapture historic music that leads hearts and lives to God. *"The Chamber Music Series of Calder Baptist Church presents music of enduring quality, in a sanctuary of worship, to lift hearts to Almighty God, the source of all good, all beauty, all hope."*

So far, fifty tickets have been sold to our members, so purchase yours soon. **We plan to offer tickets to the public beginning May 14.** All ticket sales will benefit our organ renovation fund which seeks to enable us to replace the aging console of our sanctuary pipe organ (\$160,000 cost estimate). Contributions from members are cordially invited as a part of The Apollo Concert. So far, members have contributed \$20,000. Send your check to the church office to Carol's attention. Giving levels, subject to the donor's approval, will be listed in the evening program. All gifts benefit the organ renovation fund.

The girls and I will be with Jo this **Mother's Day** weekend as she graduates from her two year program of additional Dyslexia Training at Scottish Rite Hospital in Dallas. I am grateful to Ed Wilson for sharing a sermon with you on Mother's Day. You will be in my thoughts and prayers as I also remember my own mom on this special day.
