Pastor's Pen . . . July 2, 2018

Jo has lived at some distance from the cornfields of her home in central Illinois for the almost forty-four years of our marriage. If you have never seen those fields, it may be hard to imagine the joy that she experienced as we traveled the last fifty miles to our destination on farm roads that required inching up to stop signs to see beyond the corn planted almost even with the roadways. After we left the home of one of her college girlfriends in Carlinville, Illinois yesterday where eight couples enjoyed their annual college reunion, we passed a cornfield that gave easy access for a picture. Jo responded enthusiastically to the opportunity and I readied my phone as she approached the verdant, eight foot stalks of corn that would peak in a few weeks at about ten feet and yield up to 250 bushels per acre. Imagine my surprise when she turned toward the camera and flung her outreached arms above her head with a smile of celebration. I snapped a memorable picture of the joy that comes with the perspective of age and experience. Who would think a field of corn would engender such a response?

As we laughed and talked about her reaction, we acknowledged the wholesome feeling that comes from driving among corn and soybean fields that stretch from horizon to horizon in the flat, loam-rich soil of central Illinois. Farmers and technology have used the opportunity of such characteristics to increase the yield of cornfields from the 150 bushels per acre that I remember in college to an incredible 250 bushels per acre today. Raising such basic food simply feels right and wholesome. I'm sure that hardworking farmers think the result justifies their effort.

Most of us can't participate in the multi-million dollar enterprise of planting seed, cultivating and harvesting such a crop of corn. We can, however, invest in our friends and neighbors close to home and worldwide. If we are reflective, we will hear Gods call to plant such a crop and invest in a people harvest in the same way Jesus taught us, and with the same joy that the fields of corn brought to Jo. The human fields are ripe for the harvest if we workers are only found willing!
